### ABOUT CIC - THE MANAGEMENT OF ST. JUSTIN'S

The Congregation of the Immaculate Conception (CIC) had its inception at Panchampatti at the end of the 19 century. Rev. Fr. Julius Larmey, S.J., Rev.Fr. Augustine Pereira and Rev. Fr. Eugene Nespoulous, S.J. are honoured as the founders of the congregation. On account of the motivation given by these holy men, four dedicated women entered into a hut with a single purpose and started their community life on 2 February1899. The glorified CIC was established at Madurai as a Religious Congregation on 2 July 1911. The Congregation grew step by step in to a big tree in length and breadth of the Indian sub-continent, and other countries - Zambia, South Africa, Italy, SriLanka and Germany.

In order to secure more efficient administration, the Congregation was divided into 3 Regions namely Madurai, Paramakudi and Palayamkottai on 25 March 1984 and then to 3 provinces since 1997. It celebrated its Platinum Jubilee on May 1984 and it was promoted to the 'Pontifical Status' by His Holiness Pope John Paul II on 19 Jan, 1993. The CIC has imprinted its magnanimous steps of success from 1911 to 2011 and its Centenary Celebration took place on April 2011 at Theresa Convent Campus, Madurai.

The mission of the Congregation is to provide quality Education to students and women hailing from the backward districts of south Tamil Nadu and the vision is to strive for empowerment of women through genderdisparity, education, vocational training, spiritual and personality development and entrepreneurship.

#### HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The Congregation with its rich experience in the field of Education felt the need for well qualified and trained teachers to impart quality Education. The dream of the Congregation culminated in the establishment of St.Justin's College of Education. His Grace, the Most Rev.Dr.Justin Diraviam. D.D., J.U.D. Arch Bishop of Madurai and the esteemed Dr.T.P.Meenakshi Sundaram, the Vice Chancellor of M.K. University worked Actively to establish the foundation.

The college was declared open on 31st July 1968, affiliated to Madurai Kamaraj University. Our College has included the (M. Ed.,) Post Graduate course from 17th October 2007 approved by NCTE. FSRO/NCTE/M.Ed.,/ 2006-2007/7685, dated 9-8-07 and got affiliation from the Madurai Kamaraj University Frf.No.CDC-d/Fur. Affiln. /07-08 dated 20-09-07. From 2008-2009 onwards the college is affiliated to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University. In 2009-2010 additional intakes of 100 students are added to B. Ed., Now the sanctioned strength for B. Ed., are 200 and for M. Ed., are 35 from 2010-2011 onwards. The Nirmala Hr. Sec. School and Fatima Middle School serve as the model schools. The College is situated at 161-A, Kamaraj Salai, Madurai – 625 009. The college is gradually expanding in quality and quantity and it is reaccredited by NAAC with 'A' Grade in September, 2011. In this academic year 2015-2016 Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University (TNTEU) changed the system into two year course for both B. Ed and M. Ed with the intake of 200 B. Ed and 50 M. Ed students.

An International Seminar was conducted with the year 2014. The College has been the Nodal Agency for Single Window Counseling System for the intake 2014-2015. It has also hosted the TNTEU District and Zonal Level Sports and Cultural Events from the year 2014 onwards. All the way the Petals of Success and Glory has been strewn for St.Justin's. Hence it has been recognized and Podhigai Television Management Telecast the special features of the college on October 10th 2015 for being the Best Educational Institution in Madurai District. On 20th February 2016 St.Justin's College was awarded the Best B.Ed College and Kalvichevai Award.

The College was the winner of the Adhitya TV award on 16.12.2018.

On 6th October 2018 Our College celebrated its Golden Jubil ee Celebration reminiscending the golden services to God and Country in the past 50 years and received wishes from Papal Pope Francis, Vatican City, Italy.

The college was awarded the *Educational Excellence A ward* on 09.02.2019 by SSinfo TV.

St.Justin's College of Education is currently treading in its 52th Year and aspireshigh in is Vision and Mission.

# SECTION – II COLLEGE REGULATIONS

### ADMISSION

Though a Christian Institution, it is meant to provide education for students irrespective of caste, religion or creed provided, they abide by the rules of the institution. A graduate of any recognized University may apply for Admission to the B.Ed. and M.Ed. Courses.

### SCHOLARSHIP

The institution facilitates the students to get the various scholarships given by the Government. They are as follows:

- A) Govt. of Tamil Nadu Scholarship for Hindu SC students
- B) State Special Scholarship for Christian SC students
- C) Backward Class Scholarship for BC students
- D) Most Backward Class Scholarship for MBC students
- E) Farmers Scholarship
- F) The Harijan Welfare Department offers Scholarship to those who are eligible for these scholarships. They must be applied for by the student.

### DISCIPLINARY RULES

#### The rules of the discipline shall include the following:

- 1. Every student shall wear a clean and respectable dress and conform to the rules of modesty.
- 2. Every student shall endeavor to become a model of courtesy that is expected of her, must show respect to employees, staff and students.

3. No student shall leave the class room without the permission of the Professors.

- 4. Students should assemble in their respective class rooms both for the forenoon and afternoon sessions when the first bell is sounded.
- 5. Students moving from one class to another should do so in an orderly manner.
- 6. Students are expected to take an active interest in the cleanliness and appearance of the college. A good teacher does what is needed to be done, grows in dignity by respecting both work and the worker. Damage to the furniture or property of college will not be entertained.
- 7. Students should be well informed through wide reading about political and social problems, but should not engage in political action during the professional year. Private collection of funds may not be made without the written approval of the college authorities. Those who disturb the studious atmosphere and tone of the college will be severely dealt with. All students are expected to conduct themselves in such a manner as to safeguard the good name of the college and the teaching profession.

# SECTION - III OTHER ASPECTS OF COLLEGE ORGANISATION LIBRARY RULES

- 1. Strict silence and decorum should be maintained in the Library.
- 2. Every B.Ed. and M.Ed. Student will be entitled to borrow two books and four books respectively at a time. The return of the book should be made within a week.
- 3. During Library hours, open access is permitted to the students.

Students should not disturb the arrangement of books on shelves; a student who abuses the privilege of borrowing books will forfeit this privilege.

- 4. Students are expected to use all the books with care. On receiving a book from the counter the students shall examine it at once and call Librarian's attention to any existing damage. If she fails to do so, she will be responsible for any damage that maybe afterwards detected.
- 5. No book will be lent to a student except on her own Library card. A student borrowing or attempting to borrow a book dishonestly will be suspended from the Library and possibly even from the college at the discretion of Principal.
- 6. Students are prohibited from passing books from one person to another and from lending them to persons not connected with the college.
- 7. Books should be returned on or before the last date stamped on the return slips in the books. If that date happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be considered the 'due date'. Books taken out for use during short holiday should be returned before classes resume. It shall however be within the description of the librarian to recall any book or books lent to a student, irrespective of the time limit prescribed above.

- 8. A student's absence from the college on the due date is not a valid reason for failure to return the book on that date.
- 9. A student failing to return a book within the prescribed time will be fined one Rupee for each working day of the default. Library fines shall be paid to the Librarian. Books will not be issued to those who are in arrears.
- 10. Abook may after being returned be reissued with the special approval of the Librarian.
- 11. The books issued from the library shall be returned when a student withdraws from the college. No official conduct certificate will be granted to a student who owes either books or fines to the library.
- 12. If a book is damaged or lost, the cost of replacing it will be paid by the person held responsible.
- 13. Only current journals will be placed on the reading table.
- 14. It is compulsory for the M.Ed. student to be in the library from 2.00P.Mto 4.00 P.M.
- 15. While using the internet facility the computer must be operated with care.
- 16. Books of reference and journals should be used only in the library.
- 17. The library rules are to be strictly followed. Students will forfeit the privilege of borrowing books if they infringe in the right of others.

## **COLLEGE UNION**

The Association of all Student - Teachers will be known under the general name of the 'COLLEGE UNION'. There are also Sectional Associations for the different subjects. The Principal is the President of the Union. The Professors of the other subjects are the Vice-President of the Sectional Association concerned.

A Student Secretary and Joint Secretary are elected by the union for each of the Sectional Association. The elections shall be conducted in a peaceful manner, a panel of three nominees for each will be submitted to the Principal, whom one will be chosen by her. The President's decisions are final with regard to the affairs of the College Union and Sectional Associations.

Each student of the college is a member of the Union. The objectives of the Union and the sectional Associations shall be to study informally and discuss educational subjects and those of professional and general interest. Members of the staff and graduates of the college are welcome to attend and to participate in the meetings convened by the Union and its sections.

#### HOSTEL 1) Members shall not change the rooms assigned to them without the Sanction of the warden. Boarders should maintain complete silence during study hours. 2) Members are forbidden to use Cell Phone, Extra Light, Electric Heaters, 3) Electric Iron or Other Appliances. 4) No member shall be absent from the hostel between 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. without the previous permission of the warden. 5) Every Sunday all members shall be in their rooms shortly after dinner to be available for inspection by the warden. 6) No student shall remain in the hostel, absenting herself from class without permission. 7) No guest shall be allowed to stay in the hostel overnight. 8) Members are discouraged from inviting guest to meals. If this becomes unavoidable they must get the guest tickets before taking the guest to the mess. These are obtainable from the warden. 9) Members shall not interfere with the work of the hostel employees. Members are responsible for furniture and electric bulbs in their use. 10) Misconduct of any kind of breaking of the hostel rules will render the 11) offender liable to a warning. In extreme cases the Principal may expel the student. 12) Mess dues are to be paid by the Second Sunday of every month. Visitors will be restricted. Letters should be posted through the warden. 13)Correspondences through day students will be viewed seriously. 14) Principal is the Head of the Hostel. 15) Second Sunday of every month is the visitors day. Visitors should bring the visiting cards and get the permission of the warden. 16) Be on time in all circumstances. (Home holidays, Outing and so on...) Students are allowed to go home only for their own Brothers', Sisters' 17) Marriage. 18) The Management is not responsible when students are out without the permission of Hostel Warden and the Principal. 19) Catholic students should attend the mass every day It is advisable to get up at 5.30a.m. and go to bed at 11.00 p.m. every day.
