

IQAC Meetings:

The first IQAC Meeting was conducted on 8th August 2013 under the Chairmanship of Rev.Sr.Dr. A. Mary Delphine. All the internal IQAC members participated in the meeting and discussed the quality enhancement practices and programmes to be carried out for the ensuing academic year. The second meeting was conducted on 23.08.2013 with the external as well as the internal members. The other IQAC meetings with the internal members were conducted four times during this year.

During the year 2013-14, IQAC had plan of action at the commencement of the year towards quality enhancement and the results achieved by the end of the year are as follows.

The general plan for improvement of the quality during 2013-2014 is mentioned below:

Action Plans for the Academic Year 2013-2014

- To Introduce at least two certificate courses to B.Ed. students one in Computer and the other in Gandhian Thought.
- ✤ To conduct at least five seminars and one workshop for student teachers.
- ✤ To provide weekly counseling to all the students by the Teacher Educators.
- ✤ To arrange for special professional counseling as per their needs
- ✤ To conduct one seminar for the school teachers and one for school students.
- ✤ To undertake one Action Research Programme by the staff at the B.Ed level
- ✤ To use at least two Innovative Teaching Methods for Large Classes by Teacher Educators
- ✤ To organize one National Seminar for Teacher Educators.
- To conduct small research projects in the B.Ed. major subjects during their Intensive Teaching Practice.
- ✤ To publish Major wise Magazine.
- ✤ To have fourteen interesting clubs
- To conduct Moral Instruction classes for all th B.Ed and M.Ed students on all Wednesdays.
- ✤ To establish Sexual Harassment Cell and Anti-Ragging Cell.
- ♦ To conduct at least three colloquiums for the M.Ed students.
- ✤ To conduct Awareness programmes to the school pupils.

The second IQAC meeting for the academic year 2013-14 was convened by Rev. Sr. Dr. A. Mary Delphine, the chairman of IQAC, on 23.08.13 at 3 pm. The members of IQAC discussed about the Action Plan for the Academic year 2013-14. The external experts insisted upon the inclusion of counselling to the B.Ed students by a trained counsellor. The decision was also taken to send one senior lecturer to get the professional training as a counsellor. They also suggested the title for the Teachers' seminar as "How to reduce Suicidal tendency among School students. It was also decided to invite a psychiatrist to the programme. After a fruitful discussion all the Action Plans were accepted.

The third IQAC meeting for the academic year 2013-14 was convened by Rev. Sr. Dr. A. Mary Delphine, the chairman of IQAC, on 04.02.14 at 3 pm. All the internal members were present.

- Provision of enrichment and Remedial programme after identification of the Gifted and slow learners.
- ♦ To Conduct Model Practical Exam for B.Ed students and Model Viva for M.Ed students.

The Fourth IQAC meeting was convened on 14.03.2014 by the Principal as a special meet with the Non-teaching staff members with a purpose to evaluate the different functions of non-teaching staff in order to enhance the quality in their work. Along with the other duties to be performed by them for the maintenance and upkeep the main discussion was on introduction of Technology in students attendance, introduction of intercom facilities, e governance and its importance. It was also insisted that all the non-teaching staff should enhance their computer knowledge by attending extra special classes.

The final meeting of IQAC was convened on 27.05.2014 by the Principal at 4 pm. All the internal members were present along with the student representatives. It was an objective evaluation meet. Conducting of National Seminar and undertaking of Minor research project were the two resolutions without action. All other resolutions taken were carried out successfully. The student representatives appreciated the quality of training provided in the various phases through various curricular and co-curricular activities

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the college

St.Justin's College of Education in realization of its vision imparts knowledge, inculcates values, develops skills and such that the aspirants especially from the poor, needy and under privileged classes of society are turned out to be well trained, morally upright, socially committed, spiritually inspired and culturally rooted.

All then are meant to steer up vibrant power of women teachers to meet the emerging needs and challenges of our nation.

Though essentially a Christian institution, the college aims at inculcating spiritual values in line with the spiritual heritage of the Nation which is culturally deep rooted, morally upright, spiritually attuned and steer up the vibrant power of women youth specially culled out from the poor and underprivileged classes to meet the present day needs and challenges of the society.

In short, the vision and mission of our institution is summed up in the motto "*For God and Country*", as inscribed in the logo.

In realizing the Vision, Justin's College of Education imparts knowledge, develops skills and inculcates values in the following ways.

In our institution preference has been given to poor students. 73 out of 178 students hailing from rural area and 145 economically weaker students out of 178 students have been admitted during the year 2013-14. (These economically weaker students were identified by their parents' occupation and their annual slot less than 24,000)

THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF OUR TEACHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION ARE REFLECTED AS FOLLOWS:

The goals and objectives of our Teacher Education Institution are translated into the following academic and non-academic programmes.

a) ADMISSION POLICY:

Students for the B.Ed and M.Ed courses are admitted by the College Selection Committee on merit as per guidelines issued by Directorate of Collegiate Education.

- The prime concern of our Institution is the welfare of the young, and among them, the most poor and under privileged. The major target groups are the rural poor and dalits. (These economically weaker students were identified by their parents' level of education, occupation and their annual slot between Rs. 25000/- to 35000/-) The students from economically and socially backward groups are provided financial and educational support.
- **b**) <u>Physical Development:</u>

Competitions in sports and games:

Sports and Games take a special place in this Institution. From providing purified drinking water to the balanced diet in the hostels the Institution takes every care in building up the good health of the students.

All the B.Ed and M.Ed students were engaged in various games activities daily for their good physical health and mental relaxation. Intramural competitions were held for M.Ed and B.Ed students separately. The competitions were mainly based on athletic events like 100mts, 200mts, long jump, discuss and shot put and three major games like volley ball, throw ball and tennikoit .

Health Services:

Yoga exercises were demonstrated to the B.Ed students by Mrs A. Maria Jeya Chandra Rani, Physical Directress in the physical education classes 5 days from 17.12.13 to 21.12.13 in the college campus.

.A medical checkup was carried out for the B. Ed. students on 16.05.2014 by Dr.Jeevanantham, general physician, Leonard Hospital and his team members. Prescriptions were given after examining them.

c) Intellectual Development:

Academic excellence and building intellectual capacity to search for knowledge is the primary focus of our institution. This is achieved by

- regular contact classes,
- exposure programmes,
- update of knowledge by guest lectures,
- seminars organized by the institution,
- student seminars,
- preparation of assignments,
- discussions
- research colloquium,
- study tour, and
- library activities.

The above mentioned curricular aspects of this institution were clearly explained in the third question of this report.

d) INCULCATION OF SOCIAL VALUES :

1.Students Election:

Union Inauguration:

Students' council is formed and College Union leader and Assistant leaders are elected by the students on 30th September 2013. Major leaders and assistant leaders are elected by the students in their respective subject classes. Leaders and assistant leaders are selected for Fine Arts as well as for Games. This provides an Opportunity for inculcation of leadership qualities and to acquire awareness about the democratic principles. Miss. Jenisha of English was elected as the college Union leader and Miss. Elizabeth Lourdhu Glady of English and Annal Mercy of Mathematics as assistant leaders. Miss. M.A. Mareeswari of English, as Fine – Arts leader and Miss. Kokila of Tamil as Assistant Fine Arts leaders. Miss. Jenciyana of English major was elected as sports leader and Miss. M. Shanmuga Priya of Mathematics Major as assistant

sports leaders. Miss. Maria Lavanya and Mrs. Arunodhaya., were elected as M.Ed., leader and assiatant leader respectively for M.Ed., Degree course.

The student council helps in organizing curricular and co-curricular activities and maintains a good rapport among the students, staff and the Principal. The leaders for Various Subject Associations were also selected from each major. These leaders were allowed to shoulder the responsibilities of organizing and coordinating various cultural activities and programmes conducted in the college.

2.Extension Programme:

Under this programme, the students were trained in social concern and responsibility, loyalty to the country and the community around them. Developing awareness regarding social evils such as caste, corruption, and degradation of women and violation of human rights are constitutive parts of this programme. Thus the student teachers are trained as the agents of needed social change in the country.

The College has a meaningful extension programme aimed at sensitizing students to social realities. Extension work is consequently done once in every fortnight thereby the student teachers are provided with field experience.

A Five day citizenship training camp at Viraganoor was conducted from 17th to 21st of December, 2013 so as to have a constant remembrance for our students that they are a part & parcel of the community possessing rights and responsibilities.

are given and the work is assigned according to their talents and abilities. Some of the activities are made compulsory so that the student teachers can understand the dignity of labour.

4. <u>Tuition Programmes:</u>

Our student teachers took tuitions for the educationally backward students of Fatima school from August 2013– December 2013.

Co Curricular Activities:

a. Celebrations:

An educational institution reflects the life in the society and celebrations are precious gifts of our life. Hence important National Days and festivals are celebrated inside our campus to imbibe the National values and cultural values

. Independence Day was celebrated on 14th August, 2013, presided by our principal.

Teachers' Day was celebrated on 5th September, 2013. Importance of teachers' role in society was highlighted thorough various programmes.

In connection with the Celebration of Road Safety Week, a special lecture was organised on 'Road safety and Traffic Rules'. Mr. V.Rajasekaran, S.I. of Police, Traffic Planning, Madurai City, effectively instructed the rules to be followed in the road to the student teachers.

Christmas was celebrated on 21th December, 2013 at Juvenile Justice Home, Madurai. Rexy Corera Associate Professor delivered the Christmas message. Moral, social, and spiritual values were infused in the minds of the inmates through skits, dance, and inspiring speech.

Pongal festival was celebrated on 11th January 2014 at our college premises with great enthusiasm. The students prepared pongal major-wise with the competitive spirit and enjoyed the day with cultural and traditional way. Mr.Venkatesan, Shahithya Academy Winner delivered the address on the specialty of Madurai and Pongal.

Voter's Day was celebrated on 25th January 2014 by conducting various competitions in order to insist on exercising the franchise.

Republic Day was celebrated on 26th January 2014 in the college campus. Professor Ramakrishnan, Thiagarajar college, was the Chief Guest, who hoisted the flag and gave the Republic Day message.

Our students celebrated **International women's Day** on 7th March, 2014.Mrs.Suka Joshua, Professor, English Department, Lady Doak College Madurai delivered an interesting and inspiring talk with stories from literature and her own testimony. Rev. Sr. Amalorpavam, Assistant Professor in Tamil, coordinated all the programs of women's Day in a grand manner.

Our Environment Club celebrated the internationally important environmental days such as forest day, water day and the environmental day by providing the awareness speech on environmental protection in the morning assembly. Dengue Awareness and Cracker Awareness Pamplets were given to school students by the environmental club.

<u>5. Programme on self-help:</u>

To promote self-employment and to develop dignity of labour and self-confidence in students to stand on their own legs, they were trained to produce useful materials from the waste products. To meet their basic needs in their day-to-day life, the students are trained in preparing washing powder, soap powder, Phenoil, ink, candle and preservation of food products through the introduction of a certificate course in Preparation of Home Products.

Wearing of uniform on Mondays keeps the students away from outwardly economic disparities and integrates them by developing the 'we feeling' among them.

Inclusive Education:

<u>Computer Skills Development:</u>

With a real concern for the bright future of our students, in this highly competitive and fast progressing world, all the students were given a short-term DTP computer Course and Ms-office from 05.08.2013 - 30.08.2013. This programme was offered to improve

their computer literacy so that they may cope with the changing trends in ICT (Information and Communication Technology). In this programme the content is changed according to the needs and interest of the learners.

B. Other Certificate courses:

Gandhian Thought, Jewel making, Doll making and Preparation of household products:

The institution has provided certificate courses to the B.Ed., students in Gandhian Thought. Experts from Gandhi Museum taught the Certificate courses on 19th and 23rd August 2013. Eighty seven students in Gandhian Thought, 68 students in Jewel making 92 students in doll making and 87 students in Preparation of Household products were given the certificates.

To promote self-employment and develop self confidence in students to stand on their own legs, they were trained to produce useful materials and household products such as Candle, phenyl's, soap oil, soap powder, cleaning powder, scented sticks, Adai Mix and Idli Powder etc

Personality Development:

Considering the handicaps of the rural students with regard to their personality development, the college organised many seminars to take care of this aspect of their development. Courses on personality development, value education, human rights and environment protection were provided.

SEMINARS:

Every student teacher must be trained to be responsible individuals, who are capable of making free and correct choices. Hence the young minds were exposed to reality, and to form in themselves a clear idea of the meaning of life though various seminars.

On 24th September 2013 seminars were organized on Life Coping Skills for all the B.Ed. students. Rev.Fr. Soosaimanickam, Head and correspondent Clarett Hr. Sec. School, Karumathur presented his inspiring lecture on Stress and Time Management.

On 28th September 2013 seminars were organized on Life Coping Skills for all the B.Ed. students. Rev.Fr. Santhanam, presented his inspiring seminar on 'Domestic violence and

Sr.Amalarani presented her inspiring lecture on Sexual Abuse. The students were assisted to develop the psychological coping mechanisms such as expending conscious effort to solve personal and interpersonal problems, and seeking to master, minimize or tolerate stress and conflict.

One day Seminar on 'Empowering teachers to Combat Suicidal Thoughts in Students' was conducted for School Head masters and Teachers of Madurai District Schools.

. d) INCULCATION OF MORAL VALUES :

- Once in a week Moral Instruction is provided in the evening by the Warden or Principal.
- For improving/ maintaining the Mental Health Counseling was given to the student teachers.
- Each staff was assigned 13 students for academic & personal Counselling. It is carried out once in a week.
- Morning assembly talk by the student teachers was focused on the inculcation of moral values.
- Daily morning assembly consisting of recitation of college prayer, verse reading from the Bible, a devotional song, principal's daily brief announcements, appreciation of prize winning students, and a silence for a minute form an important tool in achieving our moral and ethical goals.

e) SPIRITUAL VALUES :

As per our motto 'For God & Country', we instill the **spiritual values** among our students by organizing the following activities.

- We began this academic year with a common prayer offered by the Principal and Rev. Sisters of this college.
- Every day morning mass is made available to the catholic students, especially the hostelites.

- We mould the trainees to be effective, responsible, efficient and intelligent teachers by implanting the word of God through prayer every day. The College begins with general assembly in which prayer service is held daily.
- In the morning Assembly passages from the Holy Bible are read and college prayer is pronounced.
- A prayer room is made available for the students to enrich them spiritually. It is open at all times on all days so that the student teachers can conveniently use it for silent prayer and meditation.
- A Common prayer is conducted by the teaching and administrative staff of the college every day before the morning assembly.
- A Common prayer is spelled out in the evening where all the inmates participate.
- All important functions and meetings organized in our institution always start with prayer and prayer song.
- All Wednesdays for the Spiritual hours the themes and reflections are prepared by the staff and discussion on the same was carried on among the staff and principal and the same then delivered to the student teachers.

f) CULTURAL VALUES:

Regular encouragement of students to involve themselves in co-curricular activities provides them opportunities for multi-dimensional development.

Cultural Values are imbibed by arranging the following programmes

Participation in Cultural Programmes of Other Schools

Educational institutions maintain the continuity of social life. Celebrations are a part & parcel of this social life. It is reflected in our campus too. They also attended the School Day function of the model school and other cultural activities of Amali Matriculation School and Fatima School placed within our campus.

Celebrations:

National days such as Independence Day, Republic Day, Teacher's Day, Women's Day, Human Rights Day and Important Days such as, Voters' Day, Christmas, Pongal, Hostel Day are celebrated by the students, teaching and administrative staff members with great enthusiasm and with exchange of greetings. All the above mentioned celebrations are accompanied by skits, dance, and inspiring speech which can infuse moral, social, cultural and spiritual values in the minds of the students.

Fine Arts Competitions at the Collegiate Level:

To bring out the special talents and potentialities of students, they were motivated to take part in many talent contests. Talent exhibit program includes Essay Writing (Tamil & English), Verse Writing (Tamil & English), , cross word puzzle (Tamil &English), Elocution (Tamil &English), Singing (solo &group), Street play, Art from waste, Egg shell painting, Dancing(solo & group), Rangoli, Hair do; flower Arrangement, Bouquet Preparation, Bridal Make up, Fireless Cooking, Mehandhi and Innovative teaching Aids for the year 2013-14. The participants and the winners were honored with certificates and prizes in the college day function.

Inter collegiate Cultural competitions:

Students are further encouraged to participate in the competitions conducted at the College, University and State level. The students participated in 77 National level and 219 State level programmes during the year 2013-14

Associations:

To promote human rapport and genuine human relationships leadership qualities and cultural values, subject clubs are formed from the beginning of the course. A minimum of five subject Association meetings were conducted in the major classes to develop among the students the sense of team spirit and the ability to organize and carry out any responsible activity. The associations of various disciplines functioned as usual under the guidance of concerned major staff members. The Education Associations were conducted by the M.Ed. students under the guidance of the Education lecturers.

The Valedictory functions of the various Associations were collectively held and reports were presented department wise on 18th and 19th of Feb 2014 under the chairmanship of our principal Rev. Sr. Dr. Mary Delphine.

The various, well planned, schematic curricular, Co-curricular and Extra Curricular activities ensure the all around development of the personality of the student teachers to attain the motto '*For God & Country*'

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)

Our college offers B.Ed. as the UG programme under aided stream. In the self-finance stream one additional unit of B.Ed. course and the M.Ed. (PG) course are offered. No new academic programmes were added during 2013-14.

The Certificate course on Computer was continued this year with adequate student enrollment. Other than this four Certificate courses on Gandhian Thought, Jewel making, Doll making and Preparation of household products were newly provided this year.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

Curriculum Designing:

As our college is non-autonomous, it follows the curriculum designed by Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, Chennai. The views, suggestions and opinions expressed by the faculty members are represented to the Registrar of the University through the Principal of our college. The faculty members contributed their share of evaluation in their respective subjects through staff meetings.

Our requests to conduct the Practical Examination during the month of February in between the academic year and the bifurcation B.Ed. Theory Marks and Practical Marks into two parts for the purpose of providing separate classes were the highlights that were really considered by our University and brought about changes in this year. In this way we indirectly took part in curriculum designing this year.

Curriculum Transaction:

Curricular Planning:

This Academic year commenced on 5st August 2013, for B.Ed.Self-finance Courses. The M.Ed. Course commenced on 06.09.2013. The annual calendar given by the TNTEU for Academic year 2013-14 was added with our college unique programmes by the Calendar Committee in Sep 2013.

a) Preparation of Annual Calendar:

All the different committees of the college met twenty days prior to the commencement of the academic year to discuss the plan of action, various curricular and cocurricular activities for the forthcoming year in Sep 2013. Based on this discussion the students' Hand Book (College Calendar) was prepared by the Calendar Committee under the guidance of the Principal.

a) Preparation of Time Table:

The M.Ed. and B.Ed. general Time Table for the academic year 2013-14 were prepared by the Calendar Committee in collaboration with the Staff Committee. A special Time Table for the Micro Teaching was also prepared during the month of Sep, 2013.

a) Preparation of Academic Calendar:

. The annual calendar was prepared by the Calendar Committee showing various programs and working days of the institution. Based on this the chart for the Academic Calendar was planned by the IQAC Coordinator Dr. J. Amali Megala and the Calendar Committee with due attention and accuracy. The academic calendar base thus prepared was supplied to all the staff. Using this calendar and Time Table, each staff member prepared their own Academic Calendar for the academic year 2013-14 for all the B.Ed. and M.Ed. subjects separately.

English Bridge Course:

In this Global scenario English language has a multi various utility. Our students who are admitted in the B.Ed course come from segmented local culture and heterogeneous backgrounds. The entry level of the students, indicate their lack of fluency, accuracy and sound knowledge of grammar .It is a major handicap for a teacher who should have very good communicative skill and to comprehend the concepts for effective teaching. So the dire need of the student teachers paved a way to design a bridge course for all the learners. Hence a Bridge Course was arranged for the new B.Ed entrants to develop their communicative skill and linguistic skills. A bridge course in English was planned and conducted for the student teachers selected out of management quota. Rev. Sr. Mary Delphine Assistant Professor in English conducted the bridge course from 5th August to 30th August 2013. All the students who were admitted earlier through Management quota were made to utilize this course content which was mainly based on the functional use of all the skills like listening, speaking reading and writing.

Bridge Course Material:

The material consisted of basic words, structure, oral drills, written drills, units comprising comprehension skills, important rules to be observed in using functional grammar.

Plan of Action:

Students were motivated enthusiastically to participate in the Bridge Course and aimed at to bring effective changes in their level of readiness for opting the Optional I English Language education as well as to prepare them for mastering the language skills to develop their Communicative skills. Assignments to frame vocabulary, various sentence patterns were provided and their knowledge and skills were tested to find out whether they were eligible to select Optional I English. Final achievement test scores were taken into consideration to select them for the Optional I English subject.

MICRO TEACHING PRACTICE

Micro-Teaching:

Micro-teaching is a teacher training technique which helped the student teachers to master the teaching skills. The student teacher practiced the teaching skill in terms of definable, observable, measurable and controllable form with repeated cycles (twice) till she attained mastery in the use of skill. A separate time table was drawn to practice the micro teaching and the student teachers involved in a simulated teaching practice on September 2013. During this practice, they were trained to practice five micro teaching skills in their optional I and optional II subjects. For each skill a good demonstration was given by the teacher educator and then they were divided into small groups to practice the skill. The peer group as well as the teacher educators observed their micro teaching practice and feedback was provided immediately.

Training for Teaching

A well organized teaching practice is in vogue in our college. In our college, Micro Teaching was used with great emphasis to develop five teaching skills and competencies in handling effectively their Optional I and Optional II subjects. Series of **Micro-Teaching** skill development classes were in progression from September 2013. A well-organized teaching practice is in vogue in our college. Series of Micro-Teaching skill development classes were in progression from 11th to 23rd September 2013. The first two demonstrations for the skill of stimulus variation and skill of questioning were given in the form of **Team Teaching**, the team being comprised of all the subject staff members in order to explain the concept clearly. The **Team Teaching demonstration** was initiated by Dr. J. Amali Megala and Mrs. Rexy Corera, the senior lecturers of the college respectively and followed by the other Teacher Educators.

The student teachers were given special training to act as the supervisors and provided feedback based on the coding sheets. Apart from Peer group feed-back, the teacher Educators supervised the performance of their students in their optional subjects to offer effective, constructive criticism at the end of their skill performance.

The students daily prepared the lesson plans both for opt I / opt II subjects and specially helped to overcome their fear in teaching and they were encouraged to practice it several times till they acquire all the micro teaching skills. Totally they were trained in five skills. Efficient observation technique was used to give marks to the individual student teacher.

Link Practice:

Link Practice was also done by the student teachers comprising all the five skills practiced earlier. Each student teacher writes one lesson script for the link practice and practiced it in their optional classes before entering into the macro teaching session.

MACRO TEACHING

Model Demonstrations:

After the completion of the Micro Teaching, the Student teachers had an opportunity to witness the model demonstration practiced by eminent educators for all the Optional I and II subjects. Model demonstrations of various subjects were done by our teacher educators as well as by the experienced teachers from other institutions.

Model Class teaching was demonstrated for Tamil, English, Mathematics, Physical and Biological Science, History, Commerce and Computer Science Departments on September 2013 by our Model school teachers. On 26.09.2013 Mrs.Latha, B.T. Assistant, Government Higher Secondary School, Vellore demonstrated model lessons for science and Mathematics. Mrs. Geetha, B.T. Assistant, and Mrs. Rekha of Nirmala Girls' Higher Secondary School, Madurai demonstrated model lesson for Maths and Science respectively on 04.10.2013. Mrs Amirtham, Mr.Simeon, Mrs Aruna, & Mrs.Prema B.T. Assistants, Don Bosco Higher Secondary School, Madurai gave demonstration classes for VIII, IX and X standards respectively on 07th and 08th October 2013 for OI and OII English subject.

Mrs Saleth Mary, B.T. Assistant, of Nirmala Girls' Higher Secondary School, Madurai demonstrated model lesson for Tamil.

Our student teachers gained meticulous Knowledge on the newly introduced Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) System which is practiced in Schools by their observation in Fatima Middle School situated within the campus. After the model demonstrations, our student teachers were trained in writing the lesson plan for ALM Method.

Internship:

The internship training was given for 40 working days to our B.Ed student teachers. The intensive teaching practice was provided to the student teachers from 9th October

2013 to 7th December, 2013, after completing their intensive teaching practice successfully came back to the college on 9th December, 2013.

Objectives of Internship:

- > To apply the teaching skills in real classroom situations.
- > To acquire practical knowledge about the learners and learning environment.
- To train them to perform the duties as real teachers during the intensive practice teaching.
- To motivate the student teachers to know about the Nature of the institution and the type of learners
- > To train them to prepare lesson plans related to the syllabus.
- > To train them to integrate all the Micro teaching skills in teaching.
- To improve their teaching skills based on the various types of feedbacks provided to them.

Six demonstrations were given by the respective lecturers in macro teaching and the teacher educators helped the students individually to plan and prepare 2 to 3 lesson plans for optional I and II subjects. The students were placed in 25 schools in and around Madurai.

Feedback:

Feedback sheets were distributed to the mentors and the Heads of the institutions of these schools. The mentors observed each and every class, assessed the performance of the student teachers and helped them to modify their lesson plans and to handle the classes effectively. The Heads of the institution assessed the overall behaviour of the student teachers and the feedback sheets were collected by the student teachers after the completion of the Internship programme.

A third feedback in the printed format was collected from the class students by the respective student teacher in both the optional subjects at the end of the intensive practice and analyzed separately to understand her drawbacks and strengths.

The Teacher Educators also visited the different schools to assess their major students and provided the feedback and the ways of improving their weaknesses. The students could have responsive and pleasant contacts with the Teacher Educators through mobile phones as and when they encounter any problem in their teaching or in their schools.

The B.Ed. students were given genuine training to do reflective practice after the completion of each teaching episode and they were asked to write the positive and negative points regarding their teaching by doing self-analysis.

Each M.Ed. student was allotted one B.Ed. student according to her major subject, provided with necessary instructions to evaluate the B.Ed. student's teaching in both the optional subjects and was given three days for school visit. Our M.Ed. students after their observations, offered direct feedback to the respective student teacher and prepared the report of the teaching along with the marks assigned by them. This valid training offered to our M.Ed. students is a **unique practice** of our college.

Other Practices during Internship:

The B.Ed. students were asked to participate in the cultural programmes, celebrations of National days, important functions of the school, educational tours, field visits, Inspection activities and invigilation work of the respective school. They used to give training and practice to the school children in debate, discussion, acting, singing and dancing. They will also use at least two different innovative methods of teaching in their class.

The other important practice given to our student teachers is sharing of their teaching experience after one or two weeks of their intensive teaching. On that Saturday the student teachers visited our college and had a nice sharing of their problems, difficulties and achievements. Their doubts were clarified and problems were solved after discussion with the heads of the institutions. This is a **unique practice of the college** in which the student teachers interacts with enjoyment and try to solve each other's' problems through intense discussions.

Outcomes of the Internship:

- * Student teachers got good fresh hand experience and exposure to the real school environment which comprises teaching, learning, evaluation, the hierarchical setup and the organizational climate on the whole.
- * Student teachers' efficiency and competency in teaching was assessed and marks were awarded.
- * A good rapport was established with the Heads and the teachers of the intensive practice teaching schools.
- * The M.Ed. students get the opportunity to act as proctors to B.Ed. students and guide them.
- * The student teachers develop the ability to analyse their strengths and weaknesses from the feedbacks offered to them.

Learner Centered Pedagogy:

The college normally works on all the 180 days in a calendar year and almost all teaching hours are engaged. 100% attendance is encouraged for students. 5 marks are awarded for attendance to each student in the practicum as per the guidelines provided by the university.

Since the staff have a thorough understanding of the students, learner centered pedagogy has become the usual practice of the institution.

- The following methods were practiced by the students under the supervision of the teaching faculty.
 - -Assignments
 - -Seminars
 - -Symposia
 - -Peer group discussion
 - -Individualized instruction through Learning Modules
 - -Role Play
 - -Workshops
 - Demonstrations
 - -Panel Discussions
 - -Quiz

I.Assignments: In all the subjects, during the course two assignments were given for each student teacher. They were asked to refer related books for the topics assigned to them and submit it in time.

II. Seminars: In all the subjects one seminar was given and the students are assisted by the respective lecturers by suggesting possible reference books in the library. After presenting the paper the concerned lecturers corrected the papers and the students were asked to orally present it in the class.

III. Symposia: In the optional subjects one symposium was organized. A controversial topic was well chosen discussing with the student teachers. In order to give them training, the purpose and method of conducting the symposium was well explained. The topic was viewed in different angles by the participants and they themselves organized the symposium. Critical comments were given by the concerned subject educators.

IV. Role Plays: Role Plays were conducted in the English and Tamil major classes to develop their communicative skills and use of language.

<u>V. Demonstrations:</u> In all the Optional subjects 5 micro teaching skills were demonstrated by the teacher educators. Separate skills were demonstrated in OI and OII subjects resulting in 8-10 demonstrations by teacher educators. Eight demonstrations were given by experts from various schools in Macro lessons for each major subject and 3 other demonstrations were also provided by the teacher educators for macro teaching. One demonstration was offered for ALM Method by external experts.

<u>1.Optional I English:</u> In the language laboratory demonstrations were given in the articulation of sounds. Training in Match Stick drawing and script writing, black board Writing were given to prepare the student teachers for intensive teaching.

<u>2.Chart Drawing and Usage of audio visual aids:</u> In all the Optional subjects, special attention was paid in chart drawing and proper use of audio visual aids.

<u>3.Educational Technology:</u> In the Educational Technology laboratory demonstrations and training were given in Black board writing, Chart drawing and preparation of Slides, Film strips,

OHP transparencies and hardware handling. Opportunity was provided to all the student teachers to take the classes using the various audio-visual aids prepared by them.

4.Computer Laboratory: The students were exposed to computer operations, internet browsing and power point preparations. Demonstrations were provided by the computer experts. All the B.Ed. students prepared Power Point presentations for their Optional I and Optional II subjects and multimedia presentations for Core III subject.

5. Psychology Laboratory:

The Psychology Laboratory is equipped with 6 paper & pencil tests and 5 performance tests. These tools are well utilized both by the B.Ed. and M.Ed. student teachers. The B.Ed. student teachers were motivated to conduct psychological experiments in psychology and develop the ability to know the psychological aspects of the learners. In the Psychology Laboratory five demonstrations such as Alexander's Passalong test, Koh's Block Design test, Muller Lyer Illusion test, Finger Dexterity test and Transfer of Learning test were given to all the student teachers in batches in order to verify the facts learnt in the Psychology theory class. Six experiments were done by the B.Ed students during their intensive training programme.The experiments were

- Motivation
- Distraction of Attention
- Verbal Intelligence
- Eyensenck Personality Test
- Vocational Interest
- Negative Transfer of Learning

M.Ed. student teachers also utilized the psychology lab for doing their dissertation work.

6. Science Laboratory: The science students were instructed to give demonstrations in schools to conduct at least 5 experiments at the Higher Secondary Level. Other activities such as dissection work, specimen collection, specimen preservation and skeletal materials preparation and collection were also given proper training.

VII. Discussions and Debates: Discussions and Debates were conducted in all the Optional subjects to improve the self expression and the ability to interact with other members. These activities were assessed by awarding marks and some of the performances were evaluated through observation. Lecture method of teaching is supplemented by group discussions and seminars.

VIII. Field visits :

. Our B.Ed and M.Ed., students visited Gandhi Museum on 7th Feb 2014 and motivated by Gandhian Principles and life history. The inspiring lecture was given by Mr. Nanda Rao. The students also visited the Science Museum, Book Shop and the Library of the Gandhi Museum.

.D. Educational Tour:

A one Day Educational Tour was arranged to places to provide a variety of experiences to the B.Ed. students. All Major Students visited Kanya kumari and around that areas on 12th Feb 2014. Teaching and non teaching staff accompanied the students.

E. Library Visit:

The M.Ed. students were given the opportunity to visit the TPM Library, Centre for Research and the Library of Department of Education of Madurai Kamaraj University

IX. Quiz: In all the Optional subjects quiz programmes were conducted to update and facilitate with more facts in their subjects and to enhance their learning.

<u>X. Teaching through ICT</u>: Power point presentation by the Teacher Educators is a routine process used for the process of teaching learning. LCD Projectors have been installed in the technology laboratory and auditorium to assist the Teacher Educators in teaching through ICT.

Teacher Educators updated themselves by attending seminars, workshops, conferences, and refresher courses. Prepared notes are given to the student teachers for some of the hard nuts in the syllabus as printed matter to enhance their learning.

The experienced teachers from St. Mary's Higher Secondary School, the Nirmala Girls Higher secondary school, our model school and Fatima Middle School gave good exposure on methods of teaching through their model demonstration classes.

They enlightened the students with their informative talk and explanations on ABL method. The student teachers prepared a lesson plan for the ABL method at the end of the workshop and submitted them to the respective subject teachers.

A workshop on the preparation of Socially Useful Productive Work was organized to train the students to prepare various useful products and household materials by Mrs. Chandra, Physical Directress of our college. All the B.Ed. student teachers actively participated and exposed their novel ideas and creative talents in the preparation of different items such as jewels, baskets, artistic materials, flower vases, dolls, paintings and various kinds of hand made articles. Their performances were assessed by the respective teacher educators by awarding internal marks.

Workshop on the preparation of teaching aids

Rev.Sr. Soosaiammal, Former faculty of St.Justin's College of Education gave Handwriting and chart writing practices to the student teachers on 10th Sep 2013.

A one day workshop on preparation of projected and non-projected aids was conducted in January, 2013 to bring out the creative talents of the B.Ed. students after giving essential instructions for doing the teaching aids. The students prepared charts, models, OHP transparencies, filmstrips and slides in the presence of their subject teachers and displayed them at the end of the workshop. The teacher educators evaluated, corrected assigned marks individually.

The Valedictory functions of the various Associations were held on 18th and 19th of February 2014. XII. Library Work:

The library works from 9Am to 5 Pm throughout the year except on Sundays and government holidays. This center of learning is updated every year by addition of new volumes. In our college library, 528 books are added newly in this academic year. Five Racks were newly added in the library. Science and English Racks were extended in its heights as well as a ladder also was added. Back volumes and damaged books were kept intact with proper binding.

Journals and Magazines are displayed in a separate rack. Library has been computerized with Internet accessibility. Special training for Librarian and Library Assistant was given in the efficient usage of the computers. In the time table one hour per week is allotted as library hour for all the majors.

5. Examination reforms implemented

Internal Evaluation:

After the students were admitted, their academic skills are identified through Pre test, periodical tests and classroom interactions. Student trainees'

performances are assessed periodically for internal assessment, which consists of assignments, seminars, unit tests, workshops and symposia. Apart from that, the students' total involvement in all the college activities are also given due weightage. The institution conducted different types of tests throughout the academic year and based on these marks, the internal assessment marks were calculated for each student.

New Types of Tests: The institution conducted four types of tests such as Unit tests, Internal tests, Revision Examination and Model Examination for B.Ed. and M.Ed. In addition to these tests, new type of class tests such as Open Book Tests, Computer Assisted Tests, Viva-voce, Objective type Tests were conducted as per the convenience of the Teacher Educators in their classes and the marks were submitted.

Question paper Pattern: The internal, Revision and Model Examinations question papers were designed strictly adhering to the Tamil Nadu Teacher Education University (TNTEU) question paper pattern. For the other tests the teacher educators followed their own design according to their creative ideas.

Correction of Answer Sheets: The correction of answer papers of internal, Revision and Model Examinations were done within 10 days from the date of the last examination. The correction work for the unit tests were completed within 7 days from the date of the last test.

Feed-Back and special programmes: As soon as the correction was over, feed-backs were given to the students with constructive criticism. The slow learners, underachievers and brilliant learners were identified after each test and examination in order to provide remedial instruction, special coaching and enrichment programmes respectively in future. The high performers were guided to equip themselves to score higher marks in the external examination. The weak students are given individual attention and personal academic counselling by the concerned lecturers.

The College follows continuous, comprehensive evaluation process. Evaluation consists of 20% internal and 80% external at B.Ed. level. For the M.Ed. students there were no internal marks and 100% external marks were given.

Centralized tests were conducted on all subjects from the month of February on all days till the end of the academic year except on the Model Examination days. One Revision and one Model examinations were also conducted before the university examinations. The results of all the subjects were reviewed after every test and appropriate feed-backs were given. The slow learners and under achievers were identified and proper remedial measures were taken. The high achievers were selected and ample encouragement was provided for further achievement in the University Examination. The students were evaluated not only in their academic performance, but also in co-curricular activities. Final evaluation was made through the university examination.

External Evaluation:

A practical examination to asses their records and teaching competency was conducted by a panel of three members comprising of the Chairman and two Members from different colleges of Education is a regular feature. A viva was conducted for all the candidates and marks were awarded for their teaching competency (160 marks), Records and School based activities (240 marks). Assessing teaching competency on the first day and Viva Voce on the second day for all the candidates is the usual practice during the Practical Examination. This year the Practical Examination for B.Ed., was conducted on 10th and 11th March 2014 by TNTEU, Chennai. Dr.Thollappan, Associate Professor, Bharathidasan University acted as a Chief Examiner.

Examination reforms implemented:

- Periodical tests and Unit Tests were conducted to the students in their classes.
- Centralized daily tests were conducted on all subjects from the month of February, 2014 on all days till the end of the academic year except on the Model Examination days.
- One Revision and one Model examinations were also conducted before the university examinations. The Question Papers were got from the External source.

- The results of all the subjects were reviewed after every test and appropriate feed-backs were given to the students and teachers.
- The slow learners and under achievers were identified and proper remedial measures were taken.
- The high achievers were selected and ample encouragement was provided for further achievement in the University Examination.
- Continuous evaluation is done by the faculty throughout the year to ensure the achievements of the course objectives and to monitor the overall performance of the students, using various techniques such as observation of micro teaching and practice teaching, seminars, workshops and other co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.
- **Objective type questions:** For all the OII subjects, one unit test was conducted with objective type questions. The answer paper is evaluated at once and feed back is given at the end of the day. In Core III, the objective type test conducted was carried on with the assistance of computer.
- <u>Setting of questions by a Team:</u> Two or three Teacher Educators joined together to set the B.Ed. question papers for the core subjects.
- **Computer assisted testing:** For M.ED. and B.Ed. Objective type tests were conducted using computer as the presentation tool for questions and answers.
- <u>Conducting Model viva:</u> Before the practical examination a model viva was conducted for the B.Ed. students. Likewise Before the Dissertation Viva a model viva was conducted for the M.Ed. students.
- <u>Different New Types of Tests: N</u>ew type of class tests such as Open Book Tests, Vivavoce, Objective type and Self-evaluation Tests were conducted.

21. Improvements in the library services:

This Committee collected feedbacks from the student teachers, parents' alumnae and staff members, school students, mentors, Heads of the schools and participant of various programmes for the year 2013 - 2014.

Subject-wise and course evaluation questionnaires, evaluation of teacher educators, feedback from Alumnae, parents, peer evaluation of teacher educators, feedback sheets from the mentor teachers and Head of the practice teaching schools, school pupils etc were distributed, codified and analyzed to find out the achievement of the course objectives, to find out the impact of the various activities of the college and to find out the extent of satisfaction achieved.

The student evaluation of all the Teacher Educators were collected separately by the respective staff and self-analysed. The points to be modified were taken by them personally and noted in their Self Appraisal booklet. They themselves would suggest the correct approach/ method to improve their practices. The analyzed report was submitted to the Principal who in turn conveys all the information to the Management Council. The Management Council also meets the staff once in a year and get a separate feedback from them.

The feedback committee collected the multifaceted feedback regarding the teaching efficiency of the student teachers during the intensive teaching practice by providing the feedback sheets to the class students, mentors, H.M of the respective schools and from M.Ed students of the institution as well as teacher educators. 29. Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students:

The technology era enhances the training to teachers and the students to improve their technology skills. According to this the short – term course was provided in DTP and MS – Office to the B.Ed students in the month of August. The interests of the students played a vital role in the selection of the content.

Resource persons from Madurai Kamaraj University gave the training of SPSS (Statistical Package in Social Sciences) usage among staff members and M.Ed students.

Learning Resource Centres:

a. Psychology Laboratory:

Psychology Laboratory is equipped with 58 tools that include questionnaires, inventories, case study form; rating scales etc. to asses various psychological factors such as Personality, Reasoning ability, Memory, Level of Aspiration and so on. In addition 23 Performance test tools are also available for theory and practical instruction and for doing the experiments by students. These tools are well utilized both by the B.Ed. and M.Ed. student teachers.

b. Science Laboratory:

The science laboratories are utilized fully for developing the student teachers' dissection skill, experimental skill, manipulative skill and investigatory attitude. Apart from these, they maintain aquarium and vivarium in the laboratory which improve their aesthetic sense and love for nature. In addition they get the opportunity to view the skeletal materials, improvised lab instruments, herbarium, albums and preserved specimens.

c. Educational Technology Laboratory:

The educational technology laboratory is well equipped with TV, VCR, Slide projector, filmstrips projector and Overhead Projectors. The ET laboratory is spacious to accommodate more than 50 students. Viewing of Television, C.D.ROMs and micro teaching demonstration as well as practice by the students and lectures, shooting of micro teaching practices and usage of audio, video cassettes and CAI packages are the activities carried on in the Educational Technology Lab. The students were provided opportunity to handle these equipments and to prepare OHP transparencies. They were also given training in black board writing, chart drawing and model making, usage of OHP and Power Point Presentation.

The use of ICT has made a significant contribution to the quality of education in the campus. Compulsory computer literacy for the students and imparting of computing skills to staff both teaching and non-teaching and the use of ICT has given a boost to academic quality. The office automation, computerization of library and networking of the campus have facilitated quick and quality administration. The project office and the documentation center have ensured resource mobilization and sharing.

Teaching Faculty:

Our teaching faculty is continuously pursuing higher education with constant interest and enthusiasm. One Teaching faculty was awarded Ph.D., One teaching faculty had submitted their Ph.D work, and three others are doing their doctoral research work.

Programme for all-round development:

To train the students, in their wholesome development a seminar on "Life coping skills" which dealt on Stress Management and Time Management was conducted on 24.09.2013. Workshop was conducted on 'Preparation on Instructional Aids'. One day seminars on 'Sexual Abuse' Women's Rights 'Emotional Intelligence' 'Usage of Challans' Preparation of Multi Media package were conducted to bring out the holistic development. Important National days were celebrated to develop the personality, leadership qualities, patriotism and culture.

Construction of Research Tool:

Research tools are constructed by M.Ed., students under the guidance of their research guides and validated through pilot study. This is a special practice of our college.

Spiritual Seminars:

Arrangement of spiritual seminar is felt by the institution as it feels that ideal teacher needs to experience GOD; a spiritual wellbeing is necessary for teachers; so a Spiritual Development seminar was arranged on 04.09.2013. Rev.Fr. Victor Roche,s.j. wonderfully guided the staff in spiritual ideology.

To emphasize the importance of faith among the B.Ed and M.Ed student teachers the institution organized a one day seminar in the college premises on 13th March 2013. Rev.Fr. Jeyabalan, CMF, Chennai, acted as the resource person.

Demonstration Classes for Teaching:

ALM (Activity Learning Method) of teaching was demonstrated by the experienced teachers from St.Fatima School, and Nirmala Girls Higher secondary school (our model school) Our student teachers gained meticulous Knowledge on the newly introduced Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) System which is practiced in Schools through their effective teaching. These demonstrations by the teachers of the schools gave a good exposure on methods of teaching.

Students Council:

Students' council is formed and College Union leader and Assistant leaders are elected by the students on 30th September 2013. Major leaders and assistant leaders are elected by the students in their respective subject classes. Leaders and assistant leaders are selected for Fine Arts as well as for Games. This provides an Opportunity for inculcation of leadership qualities and to acquire awareness about the democratic principles. Miss. Jenisha of English was elected as the college Union leader and Miss. Elizabeth Lourdhu Glady of English and Annal Mercy of Mathematics as assistant leaders. Miss. M.A. Mareeswari of English, as Fine – Arts leader and Miss. Kokila of Tamil as Assistant Fine Arts leaders. Miss. Jenciyana of English major was elected as sports leader and Miss. M.Shanmuga Priya of Maths Major as assistant sports leaders. Miss. Maria

Lavanya and Mrs. Arunodhaya., were elected as M.Ed., leader and assiatant leader respectively for M.Ed., Degree course.

The student council helps in organizing curricular and co-curricular activities and maintains a good rapport among the students, staff and the Principal.

Talent Exhibit & Development:

To bring out the special talents and potentialities of students, they were motivated to take part in many talent contests. Talent exhibit program includes Essay Writing (Tamil & English), Verse Writing (Tamil & English), , cross word puzzle (Tamil &English), Elocution (Tamil &English), Singing (solo &group), Street play, Art from waste, Egg shell painting, Dancing(solo & group), Rangoli, Hair do; flower Arrangement, Bouquet Preparation, Bridal Make up, Fireless Cooking, Mehandhi and Innovative teaching Aids for the year 2013-14. The participants and the winners were honored with certificates and prizes in the college day function.

Students are further encouraged to participate in the competitions conducted at the College, University and State level. The students participated in 77 National level and 219 State level programmes during the year 2013-14

Computer Center:

At present, the college has 26 systems as a result of the financial support provided by the management. Computer education has been made a part of the curriculum. The center offers Computer fundamental, MS-Office, DTP for all student teachers. Besides the center provides internet facility and computer science students had been trained in preparing self-learning packages for school syllabus.

Inclusive Education:

Gandhian Thought, Jewel making, Doll making and Preparation of household products:

The institution has provided certificate courses to the B.Ed., students in Gandhian Thought. Experts from Gandhi Museum taught the Certificate courses on 19th and 23rdAugust 2013. Eighty seven students in Gandhian Thought, 68 students in Jewel making 92 students in doll making and 87 students in Preparation of Household products were given the certificates.

Programme on self-help:

To promote self-employment and develop self confidence in students to stand on their own legs, they were trained to produce useful materials and household products such as Candle, phenyl's, soap oil, soap powder, cleaning powder, scented sticks, Adai Mix and Idli Powder etc.

Placement Cell:

The Placement cell is active under the supervision of Sr. A. Mary Delphine and the guidance of Mrs. Rexy Corera and the student teachers enroll themselves. The pamphlets sent by various schools were displayed in the Notice Board as per the request of the student teachers.

Nearly Five schools conducted campus interviews in which 69 students attended and 23 students were short listed for appointment. Three School conducted interviews in their premises. Our Students keep the flag of the College fly high by their performance in the schools where they are placed.

Grievance Cell:

The grievance cell actively functions and the grievance box was placed in the seminar hall I & hostel Students expressed their grievances in writing and grievances that are made known through counseling sessions were also redressed by taking necessary actions by the grievance cell.

Club Activities:

Nine subject clubs functions actively throughout the year. The valedictory function of the subject clubs are conducted in grand manner.

Besides 14 different clubs functions actively on every Tuesday. Environmental club conducts awareness meetings, celebration of environmental related days, and other related programmes.

Women's Cell:

Women's day is celebrated in a grand manner by the women cell every year. This year also Women Cell celebrated the International Women's Day and Dr.Suka Joshua, Associate professor from Lady Doak College gave a wonderful talk on Women Empowerment. A rally was conducted to bring awareness on women's rights and empowerment.

Sports and Games:

Our college has full- time Physical Directress in order to develop physical health; one hour was allotted for games every day. We have Volley ball court, Basket-ball court, Badminton court, a Kho-Kho ground. Intramural Tournaments and sports have been conducted for the students on the house system. In order to encourage students in games and sports activities, sports events and competitions were held and Athletes were honored with prizes and certificates are distributed in the college day. Yoga exercises are given to the students for ten days soon after the reopening of the college. Students are given necessary training to make them participate in Extramural competitions.

Parent Teacher Association:

At the time of admission the Principal meets all the parents and highlights the rules and regulations of the college and hostel. Visitors' pass and schedule of visiting are given to the parents. Principal meets the parents on the visitor's day of every month and exchange their ideas and opinions related to the academic performance of the students. The Principal met the parents & discussed about their performance & progress on 11th September 2013 and on 26th April 2013. Parents of students attended the meeting. Parents gave their feedback and suggestions.

College Day and Graduation Day:

College Day is celebrated to bring the achievements of the college and the talents of the students to the lime light and to expose them to the community and the stakeholders. Every year Convocation is a usual programme in our institution. The Annual Convocation was held on 30th May 2014 for the Academic Year 2012-13. Dr.M.Rajiakodi, Dean, College Development Council, MKU delivered the Graduation Day Address and distributed the Diplomas for 2012-13 batch B.Ed and M.Ed Students.

Inculcation of Civic Responsibilities

The institution inculcates civic responsibilities among the student teachers through launching various programmes. Christmas Day celebration with the Juvenile Justice Home on 21.12.2013, Madurai, extending and organizing village camps with the villagers, village visit, & Citizenship Training Camp from 17.12.2013 to 21.12.2013 at Virahanoor were the programmes carried out in the academic year 2013 - 14.
